

In 1998, while guiding a wildlife tour, Janine discovered a method of identifying individual koalas by their noses. From this a wild Koala Research Project was born - mapping the home ranges, social interactions, tree use and following the lives of 100+ individual koalas in 4 locations in the You Yangs & Brisbane Ranges in south-eastern Australia. Her research was crucial to a University of Sydney publication: <u>An insight into natural koala drinking behaviour</u>; & her photo of a favourite koala was the August 2020 cover of the international science journal <u>Ethology</u>. She is currently co-authoring 3 scientific publications with University of Sydney.

Janine started the not-for-profit **Koala Clancy Foundation** in 2015 with a mission to ensure a future for wild koalas. The foundation removes weeds, plants trees, advocates & educates about wild koalas. To date Koala Clancy Foundation have planted over **129,600 koala trees**, and removed over **4.1 million invasive weeds**.
